### Adult/Continuing Education

It is the intention of the Montville Board of Education to provide effective adult education programs for resident adults, and to promote an awareness of the educational needs of adults within the community. In accordance, school facilities will be used to offer programs in such areas as the high school diploma, G.E.D., basic skills, americanization/citizenship, English for limited English proficiency students (LED), occupational skills, and enrichment.

To receive a Montville High School diploma, an adult must attain the number of credits specified in policy 6146, Credit Requirements. The physical education requirement is waived.

Credit may be given for previous academic courses successfully passed and for life/work experiences.

A course may be taken only once and its credit rendered only once as either a required or elective course.

The program is designed for the benefit of the residents of Montville. Out of town residents may be accepted in any program or course providing there is adequate space and a tuition rate established by the board of education is paid in advance.

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For courses other than regular program:

Students must be at least sixteen years of age and not presently enrolled in a secondary school.

For courses at the Montville High School Day Program:

Administrative responsibility for these students will be through the Adult Education Program. Facilities, instruction, grading, etc. will be provided by Montville High School.

Enrollment will be only in those classes where space is available. The high school will provide appropriate enrollment data. Courses may be taken for credit or enrichment.

Prospective students should be sincere adult learners with good previous school records. Admission is restricted to students whose graduation year was at least one year ago. An admissions interview will involve the adult education director and counselor, and the high school administration.

High school rules and standards will pertain to adult learners. The high school and adult education administration may dismiss a student at any time, for just cause for the general well-being of the high school program. Admission to this program is a privilege.
